



CIVIL CEREMONY & TIMES F.A.Q



.Q - Is the Venue Licensed for Civil Ceremonies?

A - Absolutely! We are licensed in our Barn and also in The Courtroom for petite ceremonies.

Q - What time should the Groom arrive?

A - The Groom, Best Man and Ushers should arrive at least an hour before the Ceremony is due to begin as both Groom and the Best Man will be required by the registrars half an hour before the ceremony starts.

Q - What time should I tell my guests to arrive?

A - Around 1 hour before gives Guests time to grab a drink and catch up with family & friends before the ceremony. We will ask guests to move through in to the Barn around 20 minutes before the Ceremony.

Q. How does the music work?

A. You can have live music (Harpist, String Quartet, Acoustic Singer etc) or send us your playlist via Spotify link, we will stream it for you, fading in & out at the appropriate moments!

Q - Can my bridesmaid or flower girl throw petals down as they walk down the aisle.

A - Yes, absolutely!

Q - Are we allowed confetti to be thrown as we leave the Barn?

A - Yes, biodegradable only please, so paper or flower petals?

Q - We are undecided if we will have a Civil Ceremony or a Church Wedding, what are the difference in timings?

A - If you have a Church Wedding, we recommend the service starts earlier as the service is longer, you have transport times to get here and you always have around 30 minutes of photo's too, so maybe 12.30 ceremony at Church would mean you'd arrive here around 1.45-2pm if C of E Church service or later with Catholic service. Whereas a Civil Ceremony the ideal time is around 1.30 pm.

Q - What happens after the ceremony?

A - After a Confetti shot outside the Barn you and your guests have exclusive use of our beautiful Marquee & Garden to have drinks and photos. No guest has to get involved with helping turn the Barn around for your Wedding Breakfast, meaning you keep all your loved ones with you celebrating! As soon as the Barn is ready, we'll come and find you to show you first! We find that most couples like to be seated around 1 1/2 hours after their ceremony, but again, we'll come and check with you and make all the announcements at the right time.

Q - Who is our point of contact at The Hundred House on the day?

A - Either Gemma, Jo, Nigel or Netty, whichever of our Management team is with you on the day (sometimes two of the above), we will make sure everything runs smoothly and that you at the right place at the right time so you don't have to worry about a thing!
